- Parliamentary Debate is a free-flowing, three person debate focused primarily on the government's definition of the resolution that relies on logical argumentation over factual evidence.
- Government defines the resolution and "this house", which identifies where the judge and competitors should frame the debate.
- Opposition adheres to the Government's definitions unless they make it impossible to debate.
- Anything not defined by the government including "this house" can be defined by the opposition and will become the standard for the round.
- The Opposition may present their own argument, but the Opposition's case should be secondary in importance and the focus of the round should be on the resolution as the Government has defined it.
